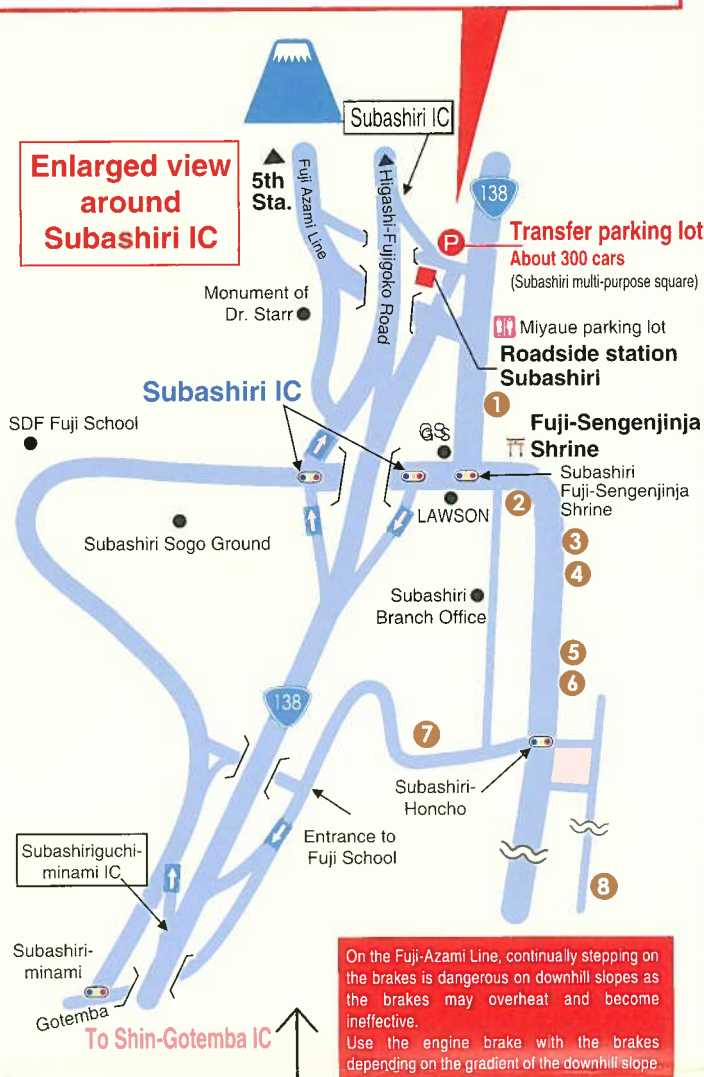

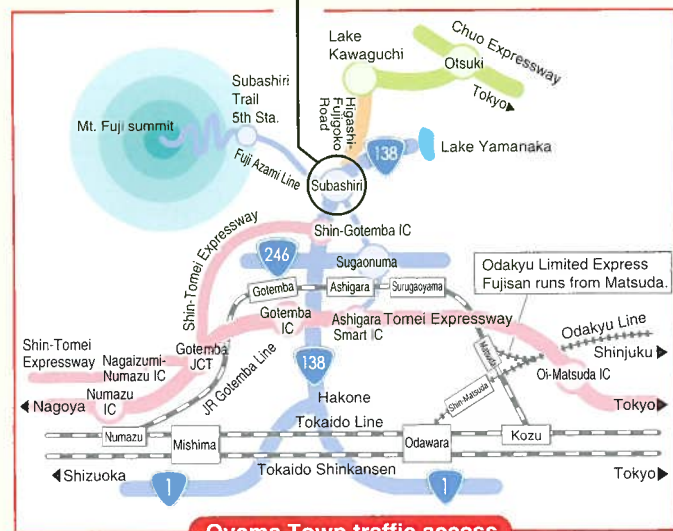

## Summit

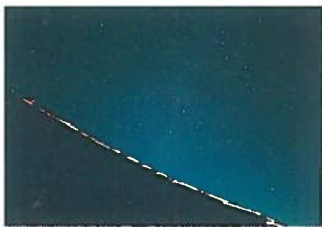
There are several mountain lodges - "Yamaguchi-ya" and "Ougi-ya" at the summit, which allow lodging, rest, meals and purchase of souvenirs. The temperature on Mt. Fuji reaches sub-zero, even in summer, depending on the day's weather. The summit can command a view of places far off, but you may see almost nothing, due to dense clouds and fog. On a fine day, you can see not only Suruga Bay and the Izu Peninsula, but also the Southern Alps and the mountains of Nikko and Joetsu, in the distance. Stone monuments are erected at the sites of two mountain springs called "Kinmeisui" and "Ginmeisui", where water once gushed out plentifully.

## Original 8th Sta. to the summit

The Subashiri Trail joins the Yoshida Trail at the Original 8th Sta. and you need to climb a steep slope called "the final hurdle" from here. In about 25 minutes, you arrive at Goraikou-kan at 8.5th Sta. The summit now seems closer at hand, but you may feel you will not reach there, no matter how hard you try, in this crucial, final stage of the ascent! After climbing about 35 minutes and passing through the torii at the 9th Sta., you arrive at "Mukae-Kusushijinja Shrine" located at a height of 3,600 m above sea level. The summit is almost there! In about 35 minutes, you will be welcomed by the torii and guardian dogs of Mt. Fuji Hongu Sengenjinja Shrine's Tohoku Rear Shrine (Kusushijinja Shrine). This is the point at a height of 3,700 m above sea level.

## Sunabashiri (Trail Down Mountain)

Sunabashiri is the tremendous trail that extends about 3 km from the 7th Sta. to the Sunaharai 5th Sta., so that you can descend in almost a straight line. You can enjoy the Subashiri trail to the fullest here. You can descend about 2 m with a single step and, in about 150 minutes from the summit, you arrive at "Yoshino-ya" at Sunaharai 5th Sta.



## Original 6th Sta. to 7th Sta.

When passing the Original 6th Sta., you'll see no large trees. Instead, the grounds are covered by plants such as Phyllodoce nipponica, Vaccinium, Trillium tschonoskii, and Trientalis europaea. When keeping hiking the lava trail, beaten in a zigzag course, those plants get gradually sparser. Within 70 minutes after leaving the Original 6th Sta., you reach "Taiyo-kan" at the 7th Sta., at a height of 3,090 m. In this neighborhood, plants such as Polygonum weyrichii, Stellaria nipponica and Artemisia pedunculosa are seen. From May to mid-June, "Subashiri Maboroshi-no-taki Falls (Wandering Falls)," a snowmelt flowing over lava, appears. In autumn, the multi-colored leaves of mugwort and larch can be seen.

## 5th Sta. to Original 6th Sta.



You start climbing Mt. Fuji from the 5th Sta. at a height of 2,000 m above sea level. After praying for safety at Komitakejinja Shrine, which has "Oyamatsumi no Mikoto" as the enshrined deity, and walking through forests of Alnus maximowiczii and other trees for about 90 minutes, you reach "Osada-sanso" at the 6th Sta. at a height of 2,400 m. After climbing through shrubs, above the tree-line in a leisurely way, for a further for 35 minutes, you reach "Seto-kan" at the Original 6th Sta. Plants that grow originally in the green Subashiri zone includerhododendrons, Lilium medeoloides and Astragalus adsurgens, which are very pleasing to the eye.

## Fuji-Sengenjinja Shrine to 5th Sta.



This Shrine's history started when the current shrinal pavilions were established at the vacant lot of a religious service site, where the extinction of Mt. Fuji's vulcanism was once prayed for. Since old times, many followers of devotional Fuji confraternities have climbed to and prayed at this shrine as a base for climbing and worshipping Mt. Fuji. This shrine has "Konohanasakuya-hime" with the enshrined deity, which gathers deep veneration as a guardian deity for the easy delivery of children and the prevention of disaster by fire. A group of monuments, erected for the accomplishment of mountain climbing in the rear approach, reminds us of bygone days. You can reach the 5th Sta., by car, in about 35 minutes.

## Mountain Climbing Regulations

### 1 Complete advance learning on Mt. Fuji preservation, safety, and climbing etiquette

You must complete either an e-learning course or an on-site orientation at the trailhead. It is recommended to complete the e-learning program before arriving to ensure a smooth start to your climb.

### 2 Pay the entrance fee: 4,000 yen per person per climb

The fee helps support efforts to ensure safe and pleasant climbing conditions and to preserve Mt. Fuji's natural environment. Payment is required under local regulations.

### 3 Overnight entry (2:00 p.m. to 3:00 a.m.) requires a mountain hut reservation

To prevent dangerous "bullet climbing" (nonstop overnight climbing), staying at a designated hut is mandatory if entering the trail during this time.

You may begin your climb once all three conditions are met.



Climbing registration must be completed through the Shizuoka Prefecture Mt. Fuji Pre-Registration System.

Climbing season: July 10 to September 10 (typical year)

## Clothing required for an ascent of Mt. Fuji

### Gloves

Gloves are indispensable. The rocks and stones of Mt. Fuji are rugged and will make your hands dirty on contact. Wear thick gloves of cotton (canvas) or other materials for keeping your hands clean and, also, as a measure against cold.

### Shoes with good 'grip' and durable soles

Prepare suitable shoes for mountain trekking! The mountain trails are comprised of rocks and sand, which can easily lead to injuries to your feet and ankles. Water-proof shoes, such as mountaineering boots or trekking shoes are the optimal choice.

### Helmet (or a protective hat) for prevention of injuries

At these altitudes, where the air is thin, the sunlight is very powerful. The mountain trails have almost no trees and the ultraviolet radiation is very strong. It is recommended that you wear a good hat for sun protection, while a helmet is also a good option, as a measure against injury from stumbling.

### Protection against cold and rain

The mountain's weather is extremely variable! Even in midsummer, the temperature may reach sub-zero in the early morning. Adjust to the temperature and weather changes with 'slip-on' type clothing.

Since the direct sunlight is strong on Mt. Fuji, protection against sunburn, using long sleeves, trousers, hats, sunglasses, etc. is necessary. Preparation of dust-masks and goggles against airborne particles makes climbing and trekking much safer.

## In case of emergency

If the Meteorological Agency issues a volcanic eruption warning of Level 3, access to the mountain is restricted and climbing ban measures are taken. If you are already climbing the mountain, immediately evacuate to a safe place, as instructed by mountain lodge nearby. If "emergency volcanic information" is issued by the Meteorological Agency, hikers may be advised to reconsider their plans. Therefore, the latest volcanic information should be checked on the website of the Meteorological Agency before climbing. If a volcanic eruption warning level of 3, 4 or 5 is issued, an "emergency alert" email will be sent to your mobile phone, smart-phone or tablet terminal (only supported models). Turn on your mobile phone or the like while you are climbing the mountain.

## Attention of Climbing Mt. Fuji

- Mt. Fuji is the highest mountain in Japan. Before you climb it, be sure to check the weather forecast for the mountain and make sure that you bring along proper clothing and provisions which may be necessary for protection from rain and cold weather.
- If the weather becomes treacherous, please take refuge in the nearest mountain lodge.
- Please do not stray off the designated hiking trails because you might cause falling rocks which could injure other hikers.
- Please carry a flashlight along with you if you hike at night and be sure to check the batteries beforehand to make sure that they work.
- Please keep Mt. Fuji clean and do not litter on the mountain. There are no garbage facilities, so all of your trash must be carried back down the mountain with you.
- There are two Safety Guidance Centers on Mt. Fuji. One is located at the 6th Station on the Yoshida trail and the other one is located at the 5th Station on the Fujinomiya trail.
- First-aids Stations are available at 7th Station and 8th Station on the Yoshida trail, and at 8th Station on the Fujinomiya trail. (First-aids Station open) Yoshida 7th Station (Mid July-Late Aug.), Yoshida 8th Station (Mid July-Late Aug.), Fujinomiya 8th Station (Mid July-Early Sep.)
- You can use only water-soluble toilet paper in the lavatories.
- Tips are welcomed and go towards keeping the toilets clean.
- Do not collect or move natural objects. That is, do not collect plants or animals, cut trees, or remove lava rocks, rocks and soil.
- Wear a helmet to protect against falling rocks, falls and sudden eruptions.
- Ropes and poles are used to mark paths. Do not grab or put your weight on them as they can come loose.

## Attention of going down the Mt. Fuji.

- There are three descending trails from the summit of Mt. Fuji. They are the Subashiri/Yoshida trail, the Gotemba trail, and the Fujinomiya trail. Be sure to choose the correct trail when descending the mountain.
- At the 8th Station, the Subashiri/Yoshida descending route splits off into two different directions. The Subashiri trail continues on the right, and the Yoshida trail continues on to the left.
- On the Subashiri and Gotemba trails, please go slowly and watch your step when descending on Sunabashiri.
- On the Fujinomiya trail, the same path is used for both ascending and descending the mountain.
- Please be careful of the crossing of the roads which are used by bulldozers. (Watch out and stay out of the way of bulldozers.)
- The guideposts on each trail are classified by colour. When descending, you should take the correct color trail.

### Roadside station Subashiri Route 138



This is the roadside station located closest to Mt. Fuji. Taking a rest at this roadside station, which is surrounded by the natural environment, with glorious, scenic views, offers you the best "healing time". Fresh, local produce and many original goods are sold here. Located along Route 138, this roadside station is also accessible from Higashi-Fujigoko Road. You can check the weather conditions on Mt. Fuji and the accommodation information of mountain lodges, right there. This facility welcomes groups and foreign tourists.
