Sunabashiri (Descending Route)

Sunabashiri is the tremendous trail that extends about 3 km from the 5th Sta. to the Sunabashi 5th Sta. where you can descend in a new straight line. Going down the Sunabashi side of the mountain is one of the most fun parts of the trail. You can descend about 2 km in a straight line after about 15-20 minutes from the summit. You will arrive at "Yoshino-yuji" at Sunabashi 5th Sta.

Original 6th Sta. to 7th Sta.

When passing the Original 6th Sta., you'll see no large trees ahead. The grounds are covered by plants such as Tsugakurusu, various herbaceous, Trillium varieties, and Arctic Starflower. While offering the odorous rock trail, the plants will become more and more sparse as you zigzag up the slopes. Within 70 minutes after leaving the Original 6th Sta., you will reach "Tayokan" at the 7th Sta. at a height of 3,930 m. In this area, you will see a lot of moss and white. Knutshood, Live hummocks, and Subarctic meadow can be found. From Mid to Mid-Land, "Mabotshi" Mabotshi-nishi (Lake) (Phantom Waterfall), a snowmelt "fountain" ever flow appears in the middle of the slopes of mgok and Urchi can be seen.

5th Sta. to Original 6th Sta.

You start climbing Mt. Fuji from the 5th Sta. at a height of 2,000 m above sea level. After praying for safety at Komatsunoya Shrine, which has Oyatsuemon (nicknamed 'Mikoto') as the enshrined deity, and walking through forests of Montane Alder and other trees for about 30 minutes, you will reach "Otsuka-sanma" at the 6th Sta. At a height of 2,400 m. After a 35 minute climb through thin shrubbery above the tree line, after about 35 minutes you will find yourself at "Soto-kari" at the 7th Sta. The plants native to the Forest Zone include Rhododendrons, Wheel lilies, and Violet milkweeds.

The shrine's history began when the first ritual service was performed in the location of a religious service center in the Meiji era. Fujisaki Shrine is a Shinto shrine with a long history of Shintoism. Fujisaki Shrine has been a place of worship for a long time, and it is one of the most important shrines in the area. The shrine is located in the center of the city, and it is a popular destination for visitors. The shrine is a beautiful example of traditional Japanese architecture, and it is a great place to visit for anyone interested in Japanese culture.

Steps Before Climbing

- 1 Complete the pre-climb safety course on Mt. Fuji preservation safety, and climbing etiquette**
You must complete either an e-learning course or an on-site orientation at the trailhead. It is recommended to complete the e-learning program before arriving to ensure a smooth start to your climb.
- 2 Pay the entrance fee: 4,000 yen per person per climb**
The fee helps support efforts to ensure safe and pleasant climbing conditions and to preserve Mt. Fuji's natural environment. Payment is required under local regulations.
- 3 Overnight entry (2:00 p.m. to 3:00 a.m.) requires a mountain hut reservation**
To prevent dangerous "boulder climbing" (nonstop overnight climbing), staying at a mountain hut is required for those climbing between 2:00 p.m. and 3:00 a.m.

Advice for your climb

- Mt Fuji is the highest mountain in Japan. Before you climb it, be sure to check the weather forecast for the mountain and make sure you have proper clothing and provisions for protection from rain and cold weather.
- The mountain is very steep, so please take a walk in the nearest mountain village.
- Please do not throw off the designated hiking trails because they could cause falling rocks that could injure other hikers.
- Please carry a flashlight with you if you hike at night and be sure to check the batteries and the flashlight, since they may be used.
- Please keep Mt. Fuji clean and do not litter at night. There are no garbage facilities, so all of your trash must be carried back down the mountain with you.
- There are three Safety Guidance Centers on Mt. Fuji. One is located at the 5th Station on the Yoshida trail, and the other two are located at the 7th and 8th Stations on the Fujinomiya trail.
- First aid Stations are available at the 7th and 8th Stations on the Yoshida trail, and at 8th Station on the Fujinomiya trail.
- First-aid stations open: Yoshida (Sun-Mon-July 4th-Late Aug.), Yoshida 8th Station (Mon-July 4th-Late Aug.), Fujinomiya (Sun-July 4th-Late Aug.).
- You may only use water-bottle-toilet paper (toilet paper) in the lavatories.
- Tips are welcomed and go towards keeping the mountain clean.
- Do not collect plants or animals, but trees, or remove rocks or soil.
- Please be advised to protect your legs from falling rocks. Do not fall or slip down.
- Poles and poles are used to mark paths. Do not pull or push your weight on them as they can come loose.

Advice for a Face Descent

- There are three descending trails from the summit of Mt. Fuji. They are the Subashiri/Yoshida trail, the Gotemba trail, and the Fujinomiya trail. Be sure to choose the correct trail when descending the mountain.
- Mt. Ito (Mt. Saito) is the Subashiri trail's descending route. It splits off into two different directions. The Subashiri trail continues to the right, and the Yoshida trail continues to the left.
- On the Subashiri and Gotemba trails, please go slowly and watch your step when descending via Subashiri.
- On the Fujinomiya trail, the same path is used for both ascending and descending the mountain.
- Please be careful of the crossing the roads (which are used by vehicles).
- Watch out and stay out of the way of the vehicles.

The 4,756 meters on trail are classified by colour. When descending, you should take the **SPRING** route.

Guidance to facilities

Roadside station Subashiri Route 138

This is the roadside station located closest to Mt. Fuji. Taking a rest at this roadside pit on, which is surrounded by a natural environment with glorious, scenic views offers you the best healing time. Fresh local produce and many original goods are sold here. Located along Route 138, this roadside station is also accessible from Higashi-Fujikyo Road. You can check the weather conditions on Mt. Fuji and the astronomical information of the surrounding area as well.
